MEMBER APPRECIATION

Wow! I can't believe I've been on the CMRS Board of Directors for a year. My portfolio for 2008/2009 was Member Appreciation.

Let me start out by saying that I've enjoyed every Membership Appreciation Night we attended. I was very disappointed that the 2008 dinner was cancelled due to lack of ticket sales.

In December 2008, we sent out a mass email to CMRS members asking for their input on whether we should continue having a Membership Appreciation Night at the Glenmore Inn or possibly at a different venue and what time of year would be good for people. We followed up with a request in the Orderboard asking people to give us their input about this event.

At the AGM held on October 18th, we displayed a pie chart which summarized the responses. 30 people out of possible 335 gave us their input. That's less than 10% of the membership. 10 people thought we should stop having a Member Appreciation event and put the money towards Rail Fan events. 20 people suggested continue with Member Appreciation but in a modified format to keep costs down.

When I presented these findings at the AGM, I posed the question "What do you want?" Mike Borkristl proposed we combine SUPERTRAIN Saturday Night with Membership Appreciation Night since a number of people Mike spoke with said SUPERTRAIN Saturday and Membership Appreciation were too close to each other and they could not afford both.

Gord Smith suggested we display the names of the volunteers at the dinner and mail the certificates. [Ed. note: We had planned on doing exactly that at the AGM, but ran into time constraints leading up to the event. See the accompanying story at right for more information about this. -Jon]

I will be talking with the organizers of SUPERTRAIN Saturday to see how we can combine the two events for 2010.

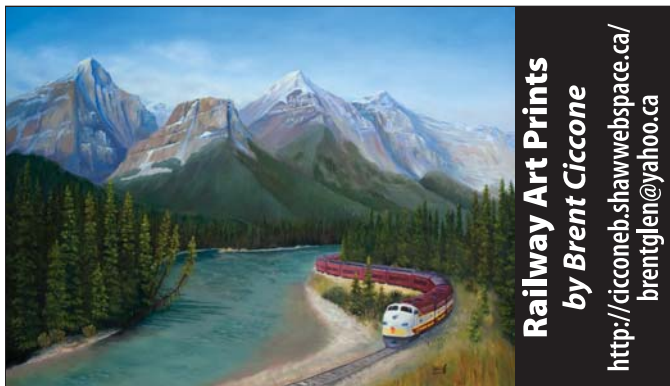
