

HOW TO PRINT A PINTEREST SIGN

1. Setup a Pinterest account to receive signage of your chosen topic by e-mail.
2. When you receive your initial e-mail from Pinterest, right click on a choice of signage (named at bottom of each box) to download pictures.
3. You will either receive signage or you can scroll usually to the next page and type in your choice into "SEARCH" box at the top of the page.
4. Pick the best of what you see, double left click
5. You will see the same one by itself
6. Single right click - choose "Save the Picture As"
7. Rename in ".jpg" format then save to Desktop
8. Double left click allows you to see an enlarged photo with "TOOLS" at top of display
9. Single left click on TOOLS then another left click on "resize" will let you resize the photo by changing different settings
10. Now you can resize, then OK
11. Resized photo will show on your Desktop renamed "resize of xxxxx" in metric measurements (cm.), PRINT

SEA WALL COLORING

1. Apply black wash (1 pint alcohol: 1 teaspoon black India Ink), let dry.
2. Dry brush with white paint to highlight edges of detail, let dry. This step is optional but recommended.
3. Brush on a band of Grimy Black onto the bottom of the wall representing the lowest point exposed when the tide goes out, let dry.
4. Apply (with a fan brush) green weathering powder acting as a band of algae just above the black muck line, overlap a bit towards the top of the wall.
5. Adding seaweed to the (dry) muck line: Brush on Clear Gloss Varnish (Liquitex Gloss Medium and Varnish #5032) to the black muck line then add with tweezers green scenic foam (representing a band of algae or seaweed onto the still wet varnish blow away extra foam, let dry.
6. Dab more Grimy Black to the algae up to the top of the muck line, (brushing will remove some foam). Let some green scenic foam still appear above the muck line.

1. MIKE CHAMBERS: (www.railroad-line.com). This page allows you to see all sorts of Craftsman kit information (but has not been recently updated). You may fit see the daily update.
 - a. Choose "Forums" at the top of the page underneath the logo.
 - b. Choose "Mike Chambers Craftsman Corner"
 - c. Choose "Modeling Information and Techniques"
 - d. Choose "Index to Craftsman Corner Construction Threads".
 - e. See Craftsman Kits-sorted (top half of listing), or alphabetically (bottom half). This list has not been updated. You will not find every kit.
 - f. Can't find a kit listed ????. Take a chance as I did with a kit made by Rail Scale Minatures called "Delwins Boat and Net Storage".
 - g. I type in : "Delwins Boat and Net Storage" and under Railroad Line Forums- "Delwins Boat and Net Storage" got an 81 page construction thread posted by someone.
2. DAVE FRARY: "(dave frary makes water)". Worth a view, he sells DVD's.
3. TROELS KIRK: (www.troelskirk.com) then view "Making waves on the Coast Line" . He has added videos top his site and sells DVD's.
4. MODEL RAILROAD HOBBYIST MAGAZINE: (model railroader hobbyist magazine) is a free monthly on-line publication magazine.
5. BAR MILLS: (barmillsmodels.com), makes wooden craftsman kits.
6. FINE SCALE MINATURES: Operated by George Selios, his kits are the Cadillac of Craftsman kits. His site (George Selios.com) shows videos, he has DVD and books for sale
7. FOS SCALE MODELS: (fosscale models.com), another wonder selection of affordable wooden craftsman kits.
8. INTERACTION: (interactionhobbies.com). A manufacturer from Salmon Arm, great and affordable
9. NGINEERING: (Ngingeering.com) supplies LED's and sound cards.
10. KANCALI: Sells brick rubber mat, their website has disappeared.
11. PINTEREST: (pinterest.com), an endless supply of signage. I resize and print signage. Choose one, put into Documents then right click to see "size", do so then print at home.

SOUND

1. I used 3 Ngingeering modules in my display and Soundtraxx 28mm speaker baffle kit:
 - Auto repair shop
 - Gulls in a harbor
 - Dogs and Crickets
2. Hint:- **DON 'T USE A NORMAL WALL WART** (sometimes called Power brick or ac adapter)
 - Do not use the 0.5 watt single card unit,
 - Use the 1.5 watt dual card unit.
 - 5 watt amp is available with volume control
 - Use double sided sticky take on styrene backing for mounting speakers and electronic modules

RAM products are available, I don't like them: too much background noise drowning out the effect you want but sound output is rated at 2.5 watts I believe. The sound card is rather large for many installations. I am not aware of other sound effect manufacturers and I do not download from a computer into an EPROM or equivalent.
